


SAFETY

It's that time of year again. Schools are back open and school buses are out and about. Reminding our drivers about school zones and curious children are only part of the equation. When to stop and when we do not need to stop when around these vehicles is the other.

When a bus has its lights flashing yellow it is time to slow and cover the brake, they are getting ready to stop. When the flashing turns to red (and in most cases the stop sign comes out from the side) we must come to a complete stop if... We are behind the bus on a single or multi-lane each way undivided street. Coming at the bus we must stop if on a single or multiple lane each way undivided street. If there is a grass or raised median the traffic coming at the bus on the opposite side does not have to stop but should slow and in all cases keep your head on a swivel, looking for children. Remember to check the laws in your state for any deviation.
