

WHAT ARE LITHIUM BATTERIES?

There are two types of "lithium" batteries, with lithium-primary batteries not being rechargeable and lithium-ion batteries being rechargeable.

Poor storage & disposal practices can be deadly.



These batteries are common and found in cordless electronic or rechargeable devices including:

- Laptops, tablets and mobile devices
- Electric batteries for cars, scooters and bicycles
- Handheld games, controllers, headphones
- Medical equipment such as pacemakers, defibrillators and similar devices
- Cordless power tools drills, saws, lawn mowers



For safety reasons, it is important consumers:

- Do not throw devices containing lithium batteries into regular trash or recycling containers
- Identify acceptable disposal options



Improper disposal and storage of these batteries can cause extensive damage.Consumers can use the following resources for current best disposal practices:
